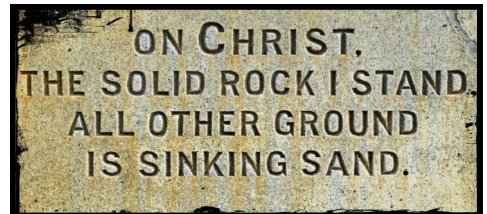

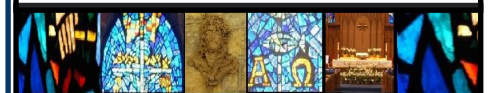

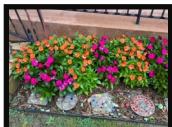


**Whistle While We Work Day**

The biggest news, well actually one of two big announcements, is that your Board voted to accept the UMC Oklahoma designation as a **LIGHTHOUSE CHURCH**. In a nutshell, this designation will give us visibility to reach out and minister to people who are from disaffiliated churches and who are seeking to find a new church home. Here is the affirmation we voted to accept (more on the website [Lighthouse Congregations](#)):

*Our congregation, University United Methodist Church, on this date (August 20, 2023), moves that we become a Lighthouse Church of the Oklahoma Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church in partnership with Annual Conference's efforts to support and provide for persons whose churches have disaffiliated, but who also choose to remain United Methodist. In doing so, not only do we commit to remaining a part of the United Methodist Church of Oklahoma, but we also commit to serving those who have lost their church homes through disaffiliation or closure. We agree to this partnership by making a covenant with the members of this church to serve in this way:*

1. **Provide a welcoming place to belong** during this time of grief and transition, which may be for a time, or forever. This includes a safe space with caring relationships, listening hearts, and an unconditional love within a congregation that is confident it is remaining in the UMC.
  - Provide all forms of pastoral and laity care.
  - This may also include providing physical space for groups of people who are in this situation, to gather as they may be considering what it looks like for them to stay together as a church or ministry within the UMC of Oklahoma.

2. **Offer ministry opportunities in which to engage.** However, there will be no pressure to do so.

- **Worship:** Providing worship opportunities either online or in person. These services should be intentional about engaging and welcoming new people into their midst. They should also include the sacraments of communion and baptism and opportunities to make a profession of faith and join the church, if desired by the individual.

- **Discipleship:** Creating space to learn and grow through small groups, like a Sunday School Class, bible study, or other small group which is a part of the church's ministry. Note: these persons may want to stay together in one of these expressions as a group.

- **Mission:** Inviting fellow United Methodists into opportunities to serve through hands-on ministries. These would include anything that falls under the ministry of the United Methodist Church on a local, district, or conference level.

Connect persons or groups with Conference and District resources to help them discern their next steps as they consider a new church home.

This is an opportunity to walk-the-walk in faith, and I pray all of us will do this with God's blessing and grace.

Double Flag Coffee also has some exciting news, but I won't steal our pastors' thunder. Just know that it is a VERY unexpected blessing (direct from GOD, I think), and it will bring a whole new dimension to this business we have all agreed to support, both in word and deed. (Fairgrounds contract!) Also, we installed a couple of new DFC board members, one being Bobby Oertel and the other Tami Losoncy, who is the General Manager of Propel, our leasing operation. It is important that we have savvy and experienced business folk involved so that we are ready to handle this entity independently. Please congratulate them for agreeing to serve.

That's the big stuff. We are doing all we can to ensure our two pastors are able to fulfill District responsibilities as well as local UUMC duties. One thing that we can all do is try to make an appointment with our pastors if you need time with them. They still want to spend time with you! Setting appointments when you can, will help them manage their schedules and help us on the Board know that pastoral care is readily available. TU and Wesley responsibilities take some of their time too. Another topic that comes to mind is the need for sound system support, which at this time remains all volunteer. If you would like to offer your time, we would be grateful. The current servants are really to be commended for their tenacity, and it would be very much appreciated if others would come forward. We need a deeper bench to cover the needs. If our budget grows, perhaps we can look at paying an honorarium to these very important positions.

May we go forth and live in our faith!


# O Lord, Hear Our Prayer
